

1 ORDINANCE NO. 853.2

2 AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE REGULATING MOBILE FOOD TRUCKS  
3 AND SIDEWALK VENDING IN THE PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY

4 (Incorporating Riverside County Ordinance No. 725)

5  
6 The Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside ordains as follows:

7 Section 1. Ordinance No. 853 is amended in its entirety to read as follows:

8 “ORDINANCE NO. 853

9 AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE REGULATING MOBILE FOOD TRUCKS  
10 AND SIDEWALK VENDING IN THE PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY

11 (Incorporating Riverside County Ordinance No. 725)

12 The Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside ordains as follows:

13 Section 1. FINDINGS. The Board of Supervisors finds that Mobile Food Truck and Sidewalk  
14 Vending provides economic opportunities to existing and emerging new businesses, as well as promotes  
15 the general welfare by increasing public access to desired goods. The Board of Supervisors also incorporates  
16 the findings of the State that Sidewalk Vending provides important entrepreneurship and economic  
17 development opportunities to low-income and immigrant communities, increases access to culturally  
18 significant food and merchandise, and contributes to a safe and dynamic public space. Notwithstanding the  
19 economic and cultural benefit to both vendors and the local community throughout the unincorporated areas  
20 of Riverside County, Mobile Vending regulations are necessary to protect the public health, safety and  
21 welfare. Specifically, the Board of Supervisors finds that regulating the time, place and manner of Vending  
22 by Mobile Food Trucks and Sidewalk Vendors in the Public Right-of-Way is necessary to protect motorists,  
23 pedestrians and Vending consumers traveling through and living within Riverside County from automobile  
24 traffic hazards.

25 Section 2. PURPOSE. Accordingly, the purpose of this ordinance is to support Mobile Vending  
26 entrepreneurship, while protecting the public health, safety and welfare by establishing regulations for  
27 Mobile Vending in the Public Right-of-Way within the unincorporated areas of Riverside County.

1           Section 3.     AUTHORITY. This ordinance is adopted pursuant to section 22455(b) of the  
2 California Vehicle Code as related to Mobile Food Truck Vending, which expressly authorizes a local  
3 authority to regulate the time, place, and manner and type of Vending from Vehicles upon any street for the  
4 public safety. Additionally, pursuant to Chapter 6.2 of the California Government Code, a local authority  
5 may regulate Sidewalk Vendors so long as its program complies with sections 51038 and 51039 of Chapter  
6 6.2.

7           Section 4.     DEFINITIONS. As used in this ordinance:

- 8           A.     Conveyance means any trailer, Pushcart, Vehicle, or Vending Stand, with or without  
9 wheels, which may be moved from one place to another under its own power or by  
10 other means.
- 11           B.     Enforcement Officer means all of the following:
- 12                   1.     Riverside County Transportation and Land Management Agency Director  
13                             and his or her duly authorized designees;
- 14                   2.     Riverside County Director of Code Enforcement and his or her duly  
15                             authorized designees; and the
- 16                   3.     Riverside County Sheriff and his or her duly authorized designees.
- 17           C.     Environmental Health Permit means an annual permit issued by the County of  
18 Riverside Department of Environmental Health in accordance with Ordinance No.  
19 580.
- 20           D.     Impound Yard means any secured area designated by Riverside County  
21 Transportation and Land Management Agency Director and his or her duly  
22 authorized designees.
- 23           E.     Mobile Food Truck means a licensed, motorized Vehicle, including any legally  
24 attached trailer, used in conjunction with the service of a commissary, or other  
25 permanent food facility upon which prepackaged or approved non- prepackaged food  
26 is sold, offered for sale or otherwise distributed as retail.
- 27           F.     Mobile Food Truck Vendor means a person, including an employee or agent of  
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1 another, issued a Riverside County Environmental Health Permit to sale any food or  
2 beverages from a Mobile Food Truck, within the Public Right-of-Way.

3 G. Notice means Notice of Violation (NOV), Administrative Citation, or property  
4 report.

5 H. Mobile Vending means Vending by Mobile Food Truck Vendors and Sidewalk  
6 Vendors.

7 I. Pedestrian Path means a right-of-way designed for public use by pedestrians and not  
8 intended for use by any motorized Vehicle.

9 J. Public Right-of-Way means forty (40) feet from the pavement edge of any road,  
10 public street, private street, intersection, county highway or alley up to, but not  
11 within, the boundaries of the adjacent private properties.

12 K. Pushcart means any pedal-driven cart, wagon, or other non- motorized vehicle,  
13 propelled by human or other non-motorized force, used to offer, display for sale, or  
14 sale any food, beverages, merchandise, goods, or wares, upon a public sidewalk.

15 L. Residential Street means any public or private street within a residential district as  
16 defined within California Vehicle Code section 515.

17 M. Sidewalk means a portion of a highway, other than the roadway, set apart by curbs,  
18 barriers, markings, or other delineation for pedestrian travel as defined within  
19 California Vehicle Code section 555.

20 N. Sidewalk Vending Permit means a permit issued by the Riverside County  
21 Transportation Director or designee to a Sidewalk Vendor in accordance with  
22 Ordinance No. 499.

23 O. Sidewalk Vendor means a person, including an employee or agent of another, who  
24 sells food or merchandise from a Pushcart, Vending Stand, or other non-motorized  
25 Conveyance, or from one's person, upon a public Sidewalk or Pedestrian Path. A  
26 Sidewalk Vendor may be one of the following:

27 1. Roaming Sidewalk Vendor means a Sidewalk Vendor who moves from place  
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1 to place and stops only to complete a transaction.

2 2. Stationary Sidewalk Vendor means a Sidewalk Vendor who vends from a  
3 fixed location.

4 P. Vehicle means a motorized vehicle as defined in California Vehicle Code section  
5 670.

6 Q. Vending means the offer, display for sale, or sale of any food, beverages,  
7 merchandise, goods, or wares, from a Conveyance, or from one's person.

8 R. Vending Stand means any stationary, non-motorized Conveyance, showcase, rack,  
9 display, tent, stand, or structure not erected on a foundation and not exceeding 120  
10 square feet, which is erected for the temporary purpose of selling food, goods, wares  
11 or merchandise.

12 Section 5. APPLICABILITY. This ordinance applies to Mobile Food Trucks and Sidewalk  
13 Vendors operating within the Public Right-of-Way in the unincorporated areas of the County of Riverside.

14 It does not apply to the following:

15 A. Mobile Food Trucks on private property, which is regulated pursuant to Ordinance  
16 No. 348;

17 B. Vending in parks owned or managed by the County of Riverside, which is regulated  
18 pursuant to Ordinance No. 328; and

19 C. California State highways.

20 Section 6. MOBILE FOOD TRUCKS.

21 A. Permits. It is unlawful for any Mobile Food Truck Vendor to offer or display for sale  
22 or sell any food or beverages without first obtaining an Environmental Health Permit.

23 B. Mobile Food Truck Vending Regulations. A Mobile Food

24 1. Location.

25 a. Mobile Food Truck Vendors shall not idle or park any motorized  
26 Vending Conveyance within five hundred feet (500') of primary or  
27 secondary schools between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.,  
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Monday through Friday, during school days.

- b. Mobile Food Trucks shall not be located within fifteen feet (15') from any fire hydrant, internal drive aisle, emergency Vehicle route, or driveway entrance to a fire station.
- c. Mobile Food Trucks shall not be located within fifteen feet (15') of a utility box or vault.
- d. Mobile Food Trucks shall not otherwise be located within any area that obstructs pedestrian or vehicle traffic.
- e. Mobile Food Trucks shall not operate on the following streets:
  - 1) West County:
    - a) Auld Road (Between SR-79 (Winchester Road) & Briggs Road
    - b) Borel Road (Between SR-79 (Winchester Road) & Sky Canyon Drive)
    - c) Cajalco Road (Between Harvill Avenue & Temescal Canyon Road)
    - d) Domenigoni Parkway (Between City of Menifee and City of Hemet
    - e) El Sobrante Road (Between Cajalco Road & La Sierra Avenue)
    - f) Gilman Springs Road (Between SH-60 & State Street)
    - g) Grand Avenue (Between Marie Drive & Corydon Road)
    - h) Highway 74 (Between City of Perris & City of Lake Elsinore
    - i) Intersection of Menifee Road & Nuevo Road (Within 500-feet from the intersection in all directions)

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- j) Intersection of Scott Road / Washington Street & SR-79 (Winchester Road) (Within 500-feet from the intersection in all directions)
- k) Old Elsinore Road (Between Clark Street & San Jacinto Avenue)
- l) Ramona Expressway (Between Hemet Street & SH-74)
- m) Ramona Expressway (Between Rider Street & City of San Jacinto)
- n) Rancho California Road (Between Borel Road & Butterfield Stage Road)
- o) Reche Canyon Road (Between Reche Vista Drive & County of San Bernardino)
- p) Sage Road (Between Cactus Valley Road & SH-79)
- q) San Timoteo Canyon Road (Between City of Beaumont & Live Oak Canyon Road)
- r) Seaton Avenue (Between Rider Street & Markham Street)
- s) Simpson Road (Between Briggs Road & Patterson Avenue)
- t) Stetson Avenue (Between San Jacinto Street & Stanford Street)
- u) Van Buren Boulevard (Between Barton Road & I-215)
- v) Van Buren Boulevard (Between Mockingbird Canyon Road & Wood Road)

2) East County:

- a) Airport Boulevard (Within 500-feet from the

1 intersection of Harrison Street)

- 2 b) Dillon Road (Between Palm Drive & Avenue 44)
- 3 c) Grapefruit Boulevard (Between 66th Avenue &
- 4 Airport Boulevard)
- 5 d) Harrison Street (Between 54th Avenue and 81st
- 6 Avenue)
- 7 e) Palm Drive (Between Varner Road & Dillon Road)
- 8 f) Thousand Palms Canyon Road (Between Ramon Road
- 9 & Dillon Road)
- 10 g) Washington Street (Between Varner Road & 42nd
- 11 Avenue)
- 12 h) 50<sup>th</sup> Avenue (Between Jackson Street and City of
- 13 Coachella)

14 2. Ice Cream Vending. Mobile Food Trucks engaged in Vending ice cream and  
15 similar food items in residential neighborhoods shall comply with California  
16 Vehicle Code section 22456, as may be amended from time to time.

17 3. Hours of Operation. Mobile Food Truck Vendors shall operate in accordance  
18 with the following:

- 19 a. In residential only areas, Mobile Food Truck Vendors may operate
- 20 from sunrise to sunset.
- 21 b. In all other areas, Mobile Food Trucks may operate between the hours
- 22 of 6:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m.

23 4. Parking. Mobile Food Trucks shall not be temporarily stopped or parked in  
24 an unsafe manner, including but not limited to impeding vehicle circulation,  
25 obstructing visibility of road conditions, or hindering the safe passageway of  
26 pedestrians in the Public Right-of- Way. Additionally, Mobile Food Trucks  
27 shall not be left unattended or parked overnight in the Public Right-of-Way.  
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- 5. Restrooms. In accordance with section 114315 of the California Retail Food Code, as may be amended from time to time, Mobile Food Trucks stopped to conduct business for more than one hour, shall operate within 200 feet of an approved, readily available and functioning restroom facility. If the restroom is within a business, the Mobile Food Truck operator must submit to the County of Riverside Department of Environmental Health written permission from the business owner providing the hours the restroom facilities are being made available for use by the food service workers. Executive portable toilet facilities with handwashing stations may satisfy this requirement.
  - 6. Noise. Mobile Food Truck Vendors shall not use sound amplifying equipment.
  - 7. No Alcohol or Sale of Controlled Substances. Serving, selling or soliciting the sale of any alcoholic beverages or controlled substances by Mobile Food Truck Vendors is strictly prohibited.
  - 8. Waste Disposal. Mobile Food Truck Vendors shall not dispose or caused to be disposed any oil, grease or wastewater onto or into streets, storm drains, catch basins, or sewer facilities.
  - 9. Signs. Mobile Food Truck Vendors shall not place freestanding displays or signs within the Public Right- of-Way, which would obstruct pedestrian or vehicle traffic.
  - 10. Trash Collection. Mobile Food Truck Vendors shall not leave any location without first picking up, removing and disposing of all trash or refuse remaining as the result of sales associated with the Vending.
- C. Enforcement. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in Mobile Food Truck Vending within the Public Right-of-Way in the unincorporated areas of the County of Riverside except in accordance with this ordinance and all applicable laws and regulations. The procedures, remedies and penalties for violation of this section of

1 the ordinance and for recovery of costs related to enforcement are provided for in  
2 Ordinance No. 725, which is incorporated herein by this reference.

3 Section 7. SIDEWALK VENDORS

4 A. Permits. It is unlawful for any Sidewalk Vendor to sell, display or offer for sale any  
5 food, beverage, goods, wares or merchandise without first obtaining the required  
6 permits issued by the County, which are provided herein. Additionally, all Sidewalk  
7 Vendors must carry their Sidewalk Vending Permit during operating hours.

8 1. Food Sidewalk Vendors. Sidewalk Vendors shall not offer or display for sale  
9 or sell any food or beverages without the following permits:

10 a. An Environmental Health Permit issued pursuant to Riverside County  
11 Ordinance No. 580, if required; and

12 b. A Sidewalk Vending Permit issued pursuant to Riverside County  
13 Ordinance No. 499.

14 2. Merchandise Vendors. Sidewalk Vendors shall not offer or display for sale  
15 or sell any merchandise, goods, or wares without the following permits

16 a. A Sidewalk Vending Permit issued pursuant to Riverside County  
17 Ordinance No. 499; and

18 b. A California seller's permit pursuant to section 6067 of the Revenue  
19 and Taxation Code, as required.

20 B. Sidewalk Vending Regulations. A Sidewalk Vendor shall comply with the following:

21 1. Location.

22 a. To prevent unintended rolling or slipping hazards, a Sidewalk Vendor  
23 shall not operate a Conveyance on a Sidewalk or Pedestrian Path with  
24 a slope greater than five percent

25 b. Maintain a clearance of at least forty-eight (48) inches on all  
26 Sidewalks and Pedestrian Paths to enable all persons to freely pass.

27 c. Sidewalk Vendors shall not operate within five hundred feet (500') of  
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1 primary or secondary schools, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and  
2 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, during school days.

3 d. Sidewalk Vendors shall not operate on the following streets:

4 1) West County

5 a) Auld Road (Between SR-79 (Winchester Road) &  
6 Briggs Road

7 b) Borel Road (Between SR-79 (Winchester Road) &  
8 Sky Canyon Drive)

9 c) Cajalco Road (Between Harvill Avenue & Temescal  
10 Canyon Road)

11 d) Domenigoni Parkway (Between City of Menifee and  
12 City of Hemet

13 e) El Sobrante Road (Between Cajalco Road & La Sierra  
14 Avenue)

15 f) Gilman Springs Road (Between SH-60 & State Street)

16 g) Grand Avenue (Between Marie Drive & Corydon  
17 Road)

18 h) Highway 74 (Between City of Perris & City of Lake  
19 Elsinore

20 i) Intersection of Menifee Road & Nuevo Road (Within  
21 500-feet from the intersection in all directions)

22 j) Intersection of Scott Road / Washington Street & SR-  
23 79 (Winchester Road) (Within 500-feet from the  
24 intersection in all directions)

25 k) Old Elsinore Road (Between Clark Street & San  
26 Jacinto Avenue)

27 l) Ramona Expressway (Between Hemet Street & SH-  
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  - m) Ramona Expressway (Between Rider Street & City of San Jacinto)
  - n) Rancho California Road (Between Borel Road & Butterfield Stage Road)
  - o) Reche Canyon Road (Between Reche Vista Drive & County of San Bernardino)
  - p) Sage Road (Between Cactus Valley Road & SH-79)
  - q) San Timoteo Canyon Road (Between City of Beaumont & Live Oak Canyon Road)
  - r) Seaton Avenue (Between Rider Street & Markham Street)
  - s) Simpson Road (Between Briggs Road & Patterson Avenue)
  - t) Stetson Avenue (Between San Jacinto Street & Stanford Street)
  - u) Van Buren Boulevard (Between Barton Road & I-215)
  - v) Van Buren Boulevard (Between Mockingbird Canyon Road & Wood Road)
- 2) East County:
- a) Airport Boulevard (Within 500-feet from the intersection of Harrison Street)
  - b) Dillon Road (Between Palm Drive & Avenue 44)
  - c) Grapefruit Boulevard (Between 66th Avenue & Airport Boulevard)
  - d) Harrison Street (Between 54th Avenue and 81st Avenue)

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- e) Palm Drive (Between Varner Road & Dillon Road)
- f) Thousand Palms Canyon Road (Between Ramon Road & Dillon Road)
- g) Washington Street (Between Varner Road & 42nd Avenue)
- h) 50th Avenue (Between Jackson Street and City of Coachella)

e. Sidewalk Vendors shall not obstruct vehicle or pedestrian traffic, not place items connected to the vending operation within the Public Right- of-Way that hinders such visibility, and shall not engage in vending within the following locations:

- 1) Fifteen feet (15') of a curb which has been duly designated by the County as a white, yellow, blue or red zone;
- 2) Five hundred feet (500') of a freeway entrance or exit in accordance with California Vehicle Code section 22520.5, as may be amended from time to time;
- 3) Fifteen feet (15') of a fire hydrant, fire escape, pedestrian signal crossing, bus stop, driveway, or any accessible curb ramp.
- 4) Two hundred feet (200') of a fire, police station, hospital or ambulance driveway;
- 5) Five feet (5') from the edge of a curb;
- 6) Fifteen feet (15') of a building entrance or exit;
- 7) Upon or within any roadway, median strip, or dividing section; and
- 8) Upon or within eight feet (8') from the edge of the pavement.

f. Sidewalk Vendors shall not operate within fifteen feet (15') of another

Sidewalk Vendor.

2. Hours of Operation. Sidewalk Vending hours of operation shall be as follows:
  - a. Both Roaming and Stationary Sidewalk Vendors may operate during the same hours as other businesses on the same street or Public Right-of-Way.
  - b. Stationary Sidewalk Vendors shall not operate in residential only areas
  - c. Roaming Sidewalk Vendors shall only operate between the hours of sunrise to sunset in residential only areas.
3. Noise. Sidewalk Vendors shall not use sound amplifying equipment.
4. Signs. Sidewalk Vendors shall not place freestanding displays or signs within the Public Right-of-Way, which would obstruct pedestrian or vehicle traffic.
5. Sidewalk Vending Conveyance and Equipment. At no time shall any Vending Conveyance be affixed to a building or structure, including, but not limited to street light posts or signs, parking meters, benches, trash cans, or landscaping within the Public Right-of- Way. Additionally, Sidewalk Vendors shall not store any equipment or goods upon a public sidewalk or pedestrian path when the Vending business is not in operation. Any equipment or objects left overnight in any portion of the Public Right-of-Way will be considered abandoned property, which may be seized and disposed of by the County in accordance with applicable law.
6. No Alcohol or Sale of Controlled Substances. Serving, selling or soliciting the sale of any alcoholic beverages or controlled substances is strictly prohibited.
7. Waste Disposal. No Sidewalk Vendor shall dispose or cause to be disposed any oil, grease or wastewater onto or into streets, storm drains, catch basins, or sewer facilities.

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8. Trash Collection. Sidewalk Vendors shall provide at least one (1) visible trash receptacle for use by customers of the Vending operation. The Sidewalk Vendor shall also collect and dispose of all trash generated by the Vending operation and its customers within a 10 foot (10') radius of the Vending location.
  9. Certified Farmer's Market & Swap Meets. Sidewalk Vendors shall not operate within two hundred feet (200') of Certified Farmer's Markets, as defined by Chapter 10.5 of Division 17 of the Food and Agricultural Code, as may be amended from time to time; and Swap Meets, as defined by Article 6 of Chapter 9 of Division 8 of the Business and Professions Code, as may be amended from time to time.
  10. Temporary Events. Sidewalk Vendors shall not operate within two hundred feet (200') of a legally permitted temporary event, which includes events that have obtained an approved filming permit in accordance with Ordinance No. 634, or an approved temporary event permit in accordance with Ordinance No. 348.

C. Administrative Fines.

1. Fine Amounts. Administrative fines imposed for violations of the ordinance related to Sidewalk Vendors shall not exceed the following:
  - a. Sidewalk Vending with a Valid Permit. A violation of this ordinance by a Sidewalk Vendor who has a valid Sidewalk Vending Permit is punishable by an administrative fine not exceeding the following amounts:
    - 1) One hundred dollars (\$100) for a first violation.
    - 2) Two hundred dollars (\$200) for a second violation within one year of the first violation.
    - 3) Five hundred dollars (\$500) for each additional violation

1 within one year of the first violation.

2 4) Upon the fourth or subsequent violation, the County may  
3 rescind the permit issued to the Sidewalk Vendor for the term  
4 of that permit.

5 b. Sidewalk Vending without a Valid Permit. Sidewalk vending without  
6 a valid Sidewalk Vending Permit is punishable by an administrative  
7 fine not to exceed the following amounts:

8 1) Two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) for a first violation.

9 2) Five hundred dollars (\$500) for a second violation within one  
10 year of the first violation.

11 3) Five hundred dollars (\$500) for a third violation within one  
12 year of the first violation.

13 4) Five hundred dollars (\$500) for a fourth violation within one  
14 year of the first violation.

15 2. Fine Reductions and Alternatives. The notice to the Sidewalk Vendor shall  
16 include the right of the Sidewalk Vendor to request an Ability-To-Pay (ATP)  
17 determination. The notice of violation shall also include instructions for  
18 requesting the ATP determination from the Riverside County Assistant  
19 TLMA Director—Community Development or designee (“Decision  
20 maker”).

21 a. ATP Criteria. The Decision maker shall determine if the Sidewalk  
22 Vendor meets the criteria described in subdivision (a) or (b) of  
23 Government Code section 68632, as may be amended from time to  
24 time, when assessing the administrative fine provided in subsection  
25 C1.

26 b. Fine deduction. If the Sidewalk Vendor meets the criteria in  
27 subsection 2a above, the Decision maker shall accept, in full  
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1 satisfaction, twenty (20) percent of the administrative fine.

2 c. Alternatives to Fine Payment. In lieu of collecting the administrative  
3 fine(s), the Decision maker may do any of the following:

4 1) Allow the violator to complete community  
5 service;

6 2) Waive the administrative fines; or

7 3) May offer an alternative disposition.

8 D. Removal of Sidewalk Vending Conveyance or Vending Equipment Creating an  
9 Imminent Danger. An Enforcement Officer may immediately seize and dispose of  
10 any goods, wares, merchandise, perishable or nonperishable foods, Vending  
11 equipment, and Conveyances, but not including Vehicles, creating an imminent  
12 danger to the health, safety or welfare of the public in accordance with applicable  
13 law. Seized items shall be held in a reasonably secure Impound Yard for a period of  
14 30 days. If the owner of the seized items appeals the citation, the impound fees  
15 (\$10.00 per day) shall be suspended from the postmark date of the appeal. If the  
16 owner of the seized items has not appealed the citation after 30 days, the items will  
17 be disposed of in a manner appropriate to their construction. If an appeal of the  
18 citation is successful and the hearing officer orders the goods returned, the goods  
19 shall be returned to their owner after all costs and fees [citation(s), impound fees,  
20 hearing fee and SOAC charges] have been paid. If the owner of the property is not  
21 the person issued the citation in the field but claims ownership at the hearing, an  
22 Administrative Citation shall be issued to the owner and must be paid before the  
23 property will be release from impound.

24 E. Enforcement. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in Sidewalk Vending  
25 within the Public Right-of-Way in the unincorporated areas of the County of  
26 Riverside except in accordance with this ordinance and all applicable laws and  
27 regulations.  
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1 F. No Criminal Penalties. A Sidewalk Vending violation or failure to pay an  
2 administrative fine pursuant to this section shall not be punishable as an infraction or  
3 misdemeanor. No person alleged to have violated the Sidewalk Vending regulations  
4 set forth in this ordinance shall be subject to arrest except when otherwise allowed  
5 by law.

6 Section 8. OTHER APPLICABLE LAWS. Mobile Food Truck and Sidewalk Vending operators  
7 shall comply with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws, and regulations, including, but not limited  
8 to the California Health and Safety Code, the California Retail Food Code and the California Vehicle Code.

9 Section 9. SEVERABILITY. If any provision, clause, sentence or paragraph of this ordinance or the  
10 application thereof to any person or circumstances shall be held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the  
11 other provisions of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application,  
12 and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable."

13 Section 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect sixty (60) days after its adoption.
