## COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA BOARD OF SUPERVISORS POLICY

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## Policy:

- 1. Installation of street name signs should be consistent with the guidelines included in the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways.
- 2. Intersections of County Maintained Roads:

It is the County's policy to install and maintain street name signs at the intersection of two (2) or more County maintained roads. A metal reflectorized street name sign mounted on a galvanized steel post (County of Riverside Standard No. 815 or 816) is used for most sign installations. Existing 4" x 4" stenciled wood posts are replaced with the standard signs when maintenance is needed.

3. Intersections of County Maintained Roads with a road not in the County Maintained System:

It is the policy of the County not to use highway funds to install and/or maintain street name signs at the intersection of a County maintained road and a road not maintained by the County of Riverside. However, street name signs may be installed by others in accordance with County Standard No. 815 or 816, using the following procedures:

- a. An individual or group may install;
- b. County Service Areas may authorize funding for the Transportation Department to install;
- c. Other situations where the Board of Supervisors authorizes expending funds to install street name signs.

The County Transportation Department is not responsible for maintaining the street name signs installed at this type of intersection.

4. Intersections of Two (2) or more roads not maintained by the County:

It is the policy of the County not to use highway funds to install and/or maintain street name signs at the intersection of two or more roads not maintained by the

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County of Riverside. However, street name signs may be installed by others in accordance with County Standard No. 815 or 816 using the following procedures:

- a. An individual or group may install;
- b. County Service Areas may authorize funding for the Transportation Department to install;
- c. Other situations where the Board of Supervisors authorizes expending funds to install street name signs.

The County Transportation Department is not responsible for maintaining street name signs installed at non-County maintained intersections.
