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GOLF CART USE ON PUBLIC HIGHWAYS G-7 1 of 1

Policy:

The following procedure is used by the County of Riverside to determine the use of golf carts without vehicle registration on a public highway:

- 1. Study of area to determine safe operation should include:
 - Determination that road is adjacent to and within one-half mile of the golf course.
 - b. Speed survey of road in question.
 - c. Review of alignment and minimum horizontal and vertical stopping sight distance.
 - d. Width of traveled way and shoulder area.
 - e. Circulation pattern of golf course traffic.
- 2. Operation should not be recommended if:
 - a. Speed zone is greater than 25 M.P.H.
 - b. Roadway paved area plus shoulder is less than 24 feet in width.
 - c. Safe stopping sight distance is below minimum for 25 M.P.H.
 - d. Practical alternative is available.
- 3. It should be mandatory that golf carts should use the extreme right side of roadway, which includes an unpaved shoulder.
- 4. The signage should conform to the recommendations of the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.
- 5. All provisions relative to the use of golf carts shall comply with all applicable sections of the California Vehicle Code or any other State law.
